## Video 114: What Kind of Bodies will we Humans Possess when we Live in the KHAA? Written by Wes Penre, January 3, 2019

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We hope you are ready for this information now. I touched this subject in the Wes Penre Papers (WPP), but I have the feeling that many people missed it. Either way, I think that it's time to address it because there are people who have asked.

On a few occasions, Ariel and I have said that beings in the KHAA (the real Universe) perceive their environment being just as physical as ours. What does this mean when the KHAA is not an atomic universe?

In this Matrix, we humans tend to distinguish between the physical and the spiritual, when in fact, they are just two aspects of the same thing. As usual, we have been indoctrinated into thinking that they are two separate things.

In the WPP, I wrote that the physical and the spiritual are the same thing. In short, it's because in the KHAA, we work with our minds—it's non-atomic. We can create worlds or whatever we want to via projection, so that others, who operate or change their vibration to that frequency band, can perceive them as well. In addition to that, there is apparently also a "blueprint" of galaxies, stars, and planets, etc. with which star beings can interact.

Let's talk about evolution and how that works in the KHAA. The early evolution of a star race is not very different from how it is here on Earth—after all, En.ki copied what was already created in the KHAA—"As Above So Below," as Thoth wrote. Usually, star races and star beings are born on, or in, the stars, but on occasion, planets are also used for this purpose, although it's rarer. Try not to compare our Sun with the stars in the KHAA—they are of totally different densities, so it's totally possible for physical beings to live on/in a star. What about if the climate on or in those stars are just perfect for the inhabitants, and there is no such thing as stars being a million degrees hot?

Star races are born in physical bodies, just like us. They take different shapes and forms, depending on what seems best for survival in a certain environment. Because the KHAA is enormously vast, we can assume that there are as many different kinds of star beings as we can imagine, and more.

While these star beings are evolving on their home world, they have physical bodies, but they are less dense than ours, and they are not made out of atoms. Do they die? Yes, it happens, but they have no amnesia and will take a new body in the same world their species was born. Do they procreate? Yes, but most star races are androgynous.

In the KHAA, an evolving star race is not to be interfered with—they need to use their freewill to advance spiritually and physically. It doesn't mean that star beings living outside the evolving construct can't visit them, but in order to do so, they need permission from the Overseer of that particular solar system or star constellation. To be able to visit another star system, the visitor needs to come as an avatar, without a physical body, because the physical bodies that develop on a certain star or planet are created to function in THAT particular environment and nowhere else. Just like here on Earth, a star being can't travel through space in a physical body, with or without a spaceship. The visitor to a certain star system will then usually shapeshift into a form that is similar to the body construct of the beings evolving in that star **system**.

This brings us to the question how star races evolve. When they've come to a certain point in their evolution, they usually start thinking about how to travel to other places in the KHAA. They quickly realize that they can't take their physical

bodies with them. If they also have concluded that they consist of soul-fire, they understand that they now have a choice—either they keep staying stationary on their world, or they abandon their physical bodies forever and leave the planet as soul avatars, consisting of trillions of fires. If they choose the latter, they go to the next step in their evolution—they become "non-physicals" or "ontoenergetic hyperversals," as the Life Physics Group California (LPG-C) called them (see WPP, Level 1).

What does this entail? It entails that they now can travel freely in the KHAA, without the limitations of a physical body. They become nano-travelers, and they travel with thoughts. The Universe/KHAA can be compared to a vast spiderweb, where the strings are intergalactic highways upon which they travel, more or less instantly, between destinations. Once at their destination, they can shapeshift into any form they like. Usually, they choose the same shape and form as they had when they were in physical bodies because that identifies them and it feels natural to them. However, they can adjust that as they please.

Once an ontoenergetic hyperversal (OH) manifests into a certain form and descends to a planet or a star, that celestial object appears just as physical to them as our own planet does to us, and they can interact with other star beings. They can arrange their fires so compactly that they appear just as physical as you and me, and you could even shake hands with them.

Now, when we have covered the evolution of star races in the KHAA, how does this pertain to us humans? Well, we humans have already gone through the "physical" part of our evolution once we leave this Matrix, and we will of course exit as avatars, without our physical bodies. We will then be in the next stage of our evolution, which means that we will not go to another planet or a star and continue from there in a denser, celestial body-bound environment. Instead, we will become OH's. In other words, we will be able to nano-travel just like the more evolved star races and form our own avatars.

This is going to be a totally different kind of existence, but we're meant to become creator gods in the KHAA, and as such, we are not going to operate in physical bodies. This might be shocking or feel odd to some people who haven't

pondered this, but I would say that it will probably be a relief not to have to deal with these dense physical, limited bodies.

This is also why I wrote about that KHAA beings don't die—not once they've become OH's. Planet- and star-bound beings can still die, but that's just in the beginning of their evolution.
