Video 190: More on Freewill and the Lack Thereof

We have spoken about freewill on and off on our video channel, and the discussion has been ongoing in the comment sections and on our forum as of whether we have freewill or not, and if so, how much? We would like to take a closer look at this because we also have some unsettling news to bring you...

When we were incarnated as Namlu'us on Tiamaat, we had complete freewill with no strings attached. We were stationary on the planet in 3-D physical bodies, but we had full memories, there was no death, and all of us had conscious access to the dimensions of the KHAA. This

means we could nano-travel, i.e. send out fires across the dimensions, in order to see things from a bigger perspective. In other words, we could be aware of so many more potentials when we were solving problems or wanted to see things from different perspectives and angles.

With freewill comes *huge* responsibility. The "harsh environment" on Tiamaat that we've been talking about (and which I wrote about in the WPP), was not so much battling great monsters and predators. It was most probably more about whether souled/spirited beings, who already inhabited love, compassion, and empathy from soul-birth (creator-god abilities) could live together in a planetary environment and work as a group, without eventually being possessive, competitive, warlike, and dismissive of each other.

The problem in the KHAA, before the Human Experiment, seems to have been that star races who developed on their designated worlds, and who were not "spirited," often came in conflict with each other, and perhaps a good portion of them became warlike and started engaging in conquest. And they had the free will to do so.

However, this became a problem when they were let out in the KHAA, and in order to keep the Universe as safe as possible, laws and rules needed to be put in place to stop the worst crimes from taking off. Could this problem be resolved by us, the Namlu'u?

I have been informed that the original experiment went just fine and was very promising until the Invaders came and took over. The Experiment continued, although the environment now became more dense and harsher (Earth). Eventually, En.ki started his *own* Experiment on Earth, behind the back of the Orions, and he created creatures that put the entire Experiment in jeopardy. He created

creatures that spread confusion and death, and they killed and ate humans, wherewith chaos emerged. Eventually, Khan En.lil decided to terminate the Experiment, resulting in the Great Flood.

The original Human Experiment went haywire when the Overlords inserted themselves here and also inserted *their* freewill into the Experiment, thinking that would allow them to give us amnesia. One could call this "The Second Invasion."

When En.ki and the Invaders made us forget who we are and our potentials. Our perceptions were severely diminished, and instead of being consciously multidimensional, we put most of our focus on the 3-D reality, thinking that is all there is. Already then, our freewill was tampered with, and we no longer knew how to consciously access the different dimensions. Instead of being capable of seeing things from a multitude of perspectives/dimensions, we perceived ourselves as just having a few options when we needed to make a choice.

As if this wasn't enough, the Overlords manipulated us further overtime, and today we have even less choices, i.e. freewill. It would be almost impossible to control the human soul group if they let us have full freewill. We still have freewill to a certain degree, but it is extremely limited—it's more like an illusion of **freewill**.

Here are a few examples of how "freewill" works in our modern society:

- 1. You can choose whether you want to take the chip that makes it possible for you to buy and sell. However, if you choose not to, you will not be able to buy groceries or pay your bills, etc.
- 2. The Government implements a draft in a war situation. You have the freewill to go to war or refuse, but if you refuse, you go to jail.

3. You can choose not to vaccinate your children, but if you do, they may not be allowed to go to school, and then you, as a parent, is penalized because school for children is mandatory. You can choose to homeschool them, but when the children are later looking for a job, they might not be employed if they are not vaccinated.

And on it goes... This is not free will, it's enforcement!

Freewill means that you have potential access to *all* options, and when you make a choice, you are responsible for the consequences of that choice in a "natural way." The Universe will give you feedback on the choice your make and you will deal with the consequences—good or bad. In this construct, however, the consequences of your choice are not natural. Instead, authorities decide *for you* what the consequences will be. This is not freewill—it's suppression of freewill. If you start pondering this, you will realize that in most areas of life you have very few choices, and regardless of what you decide to do, "someone" has created artificial consequences to your actions. If the choices you make don't fit into the mold, those in control make sure the consequences are harsh enough so that you conform and make the choice the controller wanted you to make all along, and that choice more often than not leads to deeper enslavement of your body and mind.

Hence, we can say that most of our choices are predetermined, and very little freewill exists on this planet. As mentioned earlier, real freewill would be to have all options available. If you choose an option that shows not to be beneficial for you, you might run into a barrier, but that barrier is a "natural" barrier based on circumstances, and *not* a barrier that is set up by some authority, as it were.

However, because people perceive that they can still make choices, they consider themselves having freewill. Even in areas that are not a direct threat to the Establishment, our freewill is limited. God forbid (literally) that you have too many options—maybe you will make decisions that the Overlords don't want you to make!

This is where we stand today. I am convinced you can think of thousands of situations in your life where you can see that you only have very few choices, and even then, the outcomes of these choices are preset by someone else, higher in authority.

This doesn't sound good, of course, but it *is*, compared to what the Elite has in mind for us.

A few years ago, I wrote a book called, SYNTHETIC INTELLIGENCE AND THE TRANSMUTATION OF HUMANKIND—A ROADMAP TO THE SINGULARITY AND BEYOND. You can read it online and download it. The link will be in the description box below. It's a detailed book about Artificial Intelligence and the Singularity. It's been a shocking book to read for many people, but much of what I wrote there hadn't happened yet when I wrote it. Now, a few years later, it *is* happening!

Ariel and I have often talked about the A.I. Cloud, which I usually called the "Super-Brain Computer" (SBC) in my book. In this Cloud, all our thoughts, combined knowledge, and personalities will be collected. The purpose is, according to the Singularity spokespersons, to integrate the human collective consciousness in a new, grid-like structure, where everybody has access to everything there is to know in an instant. For example, if you want to know everything about baking bread, you will, in your mind, have access to all information about baking bread that there is. Like Dr. Ray Kurzweil says, "Every human will be a billion times smarter than the smartest living person

on the planet today." He refers to that one person will have access to a billion other people's minds instantaneously. This, in conjunction with cyborg bodies that are immortal because they're built of nanobots instead of biological cells, is the Singularity in a nutshell.

Thinking about a future like this is chilling, to say the least. But it doesn't stop with this abstract idea. We just read an article in SCIENTIFIC AMERICAN called, "Scientists Demonstrate Direct Brainto-Brain Communication in humans" (see description box for a link to the article). After reading the article and relating it to freewill, we quickly realized that the illusion of freewill we have today is way superior to what is to come. Let me quote a few sentences from the issue in **question**:

Electrical activity from the brains of a pair of human subjects was transmitted to the brain of a third individual in the form of magnetic signals, which conveyed an instruction to perform a task in a particular manner. This study opens the door to extraordinary new means of human collaboration while, at the same time, blurring fundamental notions about individual identity and autonomy in disconcerting ways.

The article explains:

Three individuals sitting in separate rooms collaborated to correctly orient a block so that it could fill a gap between other blocks in a video game. Two individuals who acted as "senders" could see the gap and knew whether the block needed to be rotated to fit. The third individual, who served as the "receiver," was blinded to the correct answer and needed to rely on the instructions sent by the senders.

Overall, five groups of individuals were tested using this network, called the "BrainNet," and, on average, they achieved greater than 80 percent accuracy in completing the task.

...the first report in which the brains of multiple humans have been linked in a completely noninvasive manner. They claim that the number of individuals whose brains could be networked is essentially unlimited. Yet the information being conveyed is currently very simple: a yes-or-no binary instruction. Other than being a very complex way to play a Tetrislike video game, where could these efforts lead?

For example, could some future embodiment of a brain-to-brain network enable a sender to have a coercive effect on a receiver, altering the latter's sense of agency? Could a brain recording from a sender contain information that might someday be extracted and infringe on that person's privacy? Could these efforts, at some point, compromise an individual's sense of personhood?

It's coming, folks, no doubt about it. It will soon be reality that we can connect telepathically with technological aid, and in control of all this, on a lower level, will be the Enterprises in Silicon Valley. Ultimately, the Top Elite, and above them, the Overlords, will have complete access to all our thoughts, but there's more...there is no doubt that they will also be able to insert artificial thoughts and commands into our minds, which will make us conform to any of their wishes and plans.

This is coming out in mainstream media now, which means that this "new" technology has already been implemented for quite some time—that's how it's done. When they are presenting something new, it's already old—they just didn't tell us about it. Now, as a side note,

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could this have anything to do with all these young people who are cause to all those losses of lives in schools, arenas, and other places, where many people were killed? What commands were they receiving, and from whom?

Dear friends, this is coming, and it's coming rapidly. We just want everybody to think very hard about this. Some have still not decided whether they want to reincarnate here again to help humanity out, or if they want to exit through the Grid. Is this what you want to come back to? Do you really think you have a chance to exit after that? We can say almost certainly that it will not be possible. On the other hand, we doubt that there will be anymore reincarnations into the time-loop after this lifetime. People will either get stuck in the Singularity or, if the Overlords see some souls being fit, ascend through En.ki's artificial Ascension Program. Either way, the chances to exit will probably be non-existent. Please make your choice wisely. What I am saying here is *still* just the tip of the iceberg. We understand that it might feel scary to leave this construct that we've been so accustomed to, but if we weigh the pros and cons, which do we prefer—the future that we're evidently facing here or the opportunity to aim for something new?
